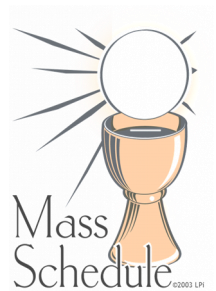

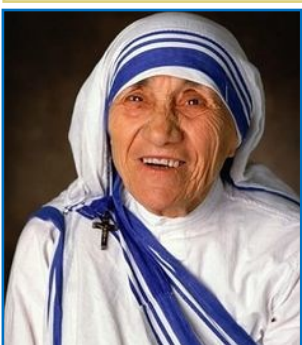
Alleluia, alleluia! Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called children of God. Alleluia!

GOSPEL

LUKE 12:22-32

It has pleased your heavenly father to give you the Kingdom. Jesus said to his disciples, 'That is why I am telling you not to worry about your life and what you are to eat, nor about your body and how you are to clothe it. For life means more than food, and the body more than clothing. Think of the ravens. They do not sow

or reap; they have no storehouses and no barns; yet God feeds them. And how much more are you worth than the birds! Can any of you, for all his worrying, add a single cubit to his span of life? If the smallest things, therefore, are outside your control, why worry about the rest? Think of the flowers; they never have to spin or weave; yet, I assure you, not even Solomon in all his regalia was robed like one of these. Now if that is how God clothes the grass in the field which is there today and thrown into the furnace tomorrow, how much more will he look after you, you men of little faith! But you, you must not set your hearts on things to eat and things to drink; nor must you worry. It is the pagans of this world who set their hearts on these things. Your Father well knows you need them. No; set your hearts on his kingdom, and these other things will be given you as well. 'There is no need to be afraid, little flock, for it has pleased your Father to give you the kingdom.'



Saint Teresa of Calcutta, Jesus called you to bring the light of His love to those who live in darkness. By tender, loving care for the poorest and the neediest, you became the sign of God's presence, His love and compassion in the midst of suffering and pain.

Following your example, help us to recognise the face of Jesus in our suffering brothers and sisters and to serve Him with humility and joy. Teach us to be carriers of God's tender love and mercy and so bear witness that God still loves the world through each one of us. **Amen**

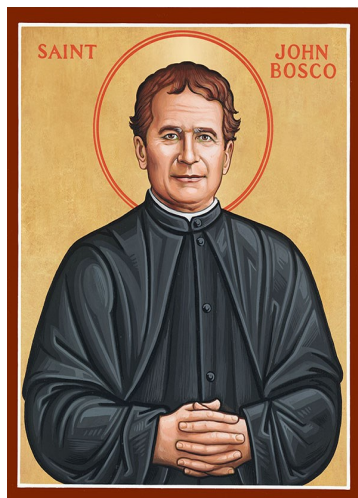
Understanding of the Word

In this passage, Jesus invites us to a radical trust in God. He tells us not to be anxious about material things—about what we will eat, wear, or how our future will unfold. Anxiety often comes from focusing on the uncertainties ahead or dwelling on the wounds of the past. Yet, God is present in this very moment, calling us to rest in Him. When Jesus speaks of the ravens and the lilies, He reminds us of God’s care for the smallest parts of creation. If God provides for the birds and the flowers, how much more will He care for us? No amount of anxiety or worry can add to our lives. In fact, anxiety is often a tool of Satan, keeping us busy, stressed, and frantic—out of alignment with God’s peace. But Jesus says, “Fear not, little flock.” We are part of God’s flock, and His plan for us is far greater than anything we could imagine. Our personal plans might change. Life may

not go as we expect. But God’s plan for our lives is unchanging. He invites us to align our plans with His. When we surrender to God’s will, trusting in His providence, we receive grace to navigate life’s uncertainties with peace. Ultimately, our best plan is the one that flows from God’s design for our lives. As we let go of anxiety and fear, we find freedom and assurance in the knowledge that God’s provision is enough. God calls us to seek His Kingdom first, trusting that everything else will fall into place. When we place our treasure in heaven and set our hearts on God’s will, we are no longer consumed by fear and anxiety. Instead, we rest in the security of being part of His flock, knowing that He will always provide for us. Let us allow God’s plan to guide us, for in His plan, we find true peace, fulfillment, and grace.

Feast of the Week

St John Bosco
31st January



John was the youngest son of a peasant family. His father died when John was 2, and the family became very poor. As a youngster, John taught religion to other boys and got them to go to church. Encouraged by a priest, John entered the seminary. Priests at the seminary saw that John was a natural leader and encouraged him to use his gifts to keep other young people out of trouble. John started gathering boys together on Sundays. They would begin with Mass, followed by breakfast and games, catechism lesson, and evening prayers. John was able to get a house for himself and 40 boys. His mother became the housekeeper. In the first 6 years the numbers grew from 40 to 150. John Bosco gave a father’s care to rowdy, neglected boys. He is known as the “friend of boys” and is often called Don, which means Father. He opened workshops to train boys to be shoemakers and tailors. He saw that in addition to getting a religious education the boys learned to play musical instruments, perform in plays, and engage in sports. He also wrote and printed books on Christian faith for boys. In 1859 John began a religious community of priests which is still active today, caring for boys who have been neglected. Because John admired Francis de Sales, he named the group the Salesians. When John died, 40,000 people came to his wake.
